importantly you reduce the plastic waste that you are creating at every lunch time.













3. SOP

a. As can be seen, the 4th floor reception is much more spacious compared to the 2nd floor reception. The primary students are to wait and to sit with social distance at the reception area after school. They took up the opportunity to read while waiting for their parents to pick them up.



b. The waiting area for the Year 7 students of J18A/B & 9 students of J16A/B is at the canteen area of level 4. All students are expected to sit at the designated chairs to exercise physical distancing.

- c. Students are to remain seated in their classrooms during break and lunchtime. Students are to eat at their tables and not share a table. Students are not allowed to go to other classrooms.
- d. Students are not allowed to remain in their classrooms after school unless told otherwise by the administration or teacher(s). If you are caught in the classroom, action will be taken.
- e. **Do not hang around in the canteen area** during break, lunchtime and after school.


